### HEERF III: ARPA

Saint Michael College of Allied Health's ARP HEERF III grant is \$75,252.00

The Higher Education emergency Relief Fund III (HEERF III) is authorized by the American Rescue Plan (ARP), Public Law 117-2, signed into law on March 11, 2021, providing \$39.6 billion in support to institutions of higher education to serve students and ensure learning continues during the COVID-19 pandemic.

ARP funds are in addition to funds authorized by the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental appropriations act, 2021 (CRRSAA), Public Law 116-260 and the Coronavirus Aid, Recovery, and Economic Security (CARES) act, Public Law 116-136. Emergency funds available to institutions and their students under all emergency funds total \$76.2 billion.

#### Eligibility

These funds are available to provide grants to students for expenses related to the disruption campus operations due to the coronavirus. A student's financial need may have increased based on recent events related to the coronavirus pandemic. Eligible expenses would include food, housing, technology, course materials, health care, and childcare.

- Students must meet Title IV eligibility requirements in order to receive an emergency grant.
- Students must remain on active status and in good standing.
- Students are required to complete the emergency funds request form attesting to the financial need has been caused by the coronavirus pandemic and commitment to use the funds as stated.

#### Allocation for Distribution

Saint Michael College of Allied Health will distribute \$75,252.00 equally and directly to students based on the number of applicants received that meet the qualifications with a minimum of \$ 650.00 per student. The payments will be paid to students by check. The College's goal is to ensure funds are distributed as widely as possible; therefore, funds will be distributed to all eligible students evenly. However,

The college has distributed \$ 650 to 109 students which makes the total amount distributed to date is \$70, 850.00. However, the remaining funds of \$4,402.00 will be distributed to the remaining eligible students before the end of the next quarter report.
